

**Confession of Faith:** The Nicene Creed

All: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary and became fully human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate. He suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who in unity with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.



That's why we ask that, when little children find it impossible to be quiet during worship, that someone from their family brings them to the parents' room until they are settled.

**New Church Chimney Needed** After a significant last Spring rain or should we say prolonged downpour, it was discovered that we had a significant problem with our chimney that would need to be taken care of before the next heating season. It should be noted that the Properties Committee knew the chimney needed to be repaired or replaced, but was hoping it would last a few more years. It turns out that it isn't true, so we contacted our boiler repair service and a number of chimney repair companies we and received a number of quotes doing rebuilds in a number of different ways from as low as \$7,000 (a quick fix good only for a year or two) to \$30,000. After reviewing all the many different methods and corresponding amounts, the Properties Committee recommended to Church Council (who approved that recommendation) that permanently repairs and replaces parts of the chimney for around \$13,000. Soon we'll be starting a *Chimney Fund* – please donate to it as God moves you.

Although we encourage parents to worship with their small children, we also acknowledge that from time to time, small children may not be in a mood for public worship. Parents may sit with their children in this room, giving their children a place to move around while they listen to the service. The Parents' Room is located off the entryway to the church.

**Visitor and Handicap Parking** We have set aside the parking places directly in front of the church on Stevenson Street (from the corner to the no parking zone) for the convenience of our guests at worship and anyone who is handicapped.

We ask our members to leave those spaces open for that purpose. That may mean that some of us will have to walk a few steps farther than we're used to, but providing parking close to church is another way we can show our guests and handicapped worshipers that we care about them. *We...ought to love one another.*
